OPITO RIGGER INITIAL TRAINING

The OPITO rigger initial training is the first step to becoming a competent rigger with learners receiving training through classroom learning and practical demonstration.

With 45 years' experience as a technical authority in crane and lifting operations, our training ensures people are developed for safety critical lifting roles at the highest standards.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

The rigger initial training is for anyone who has little or no experience in rigging and lifting operations.

WHAT IS THE DURATION OF THIS COURSE?

Three days.

WHAT ARE THE AIMS OF THIS COURSE?

To provide learners with knowledge of rigging principles, general hazards and risks of rigging and lifting operations, an awareness of relevant legislation and regulation, and an opportunity to practice basic rigging operations and follow a lifting plan in a safe environment.

WHAT WILL BE COVERED?

Training is delivered through a mix of ongoing theoretical and practical elements designed to give learners the chance to practice rigging and lifting operations.

The course is focussed on the following areas:

- Roles and responsibilities of a rigger
- Health and safety legislation
- LOLER and PUWER regulations
- Work hazards and PPE
- Lifting plans, risk assessments and preparing to lift
- Lifting operations including varied lifting techniques for challenging environments
- Post-lift best practice and procedures.



WHAT CERTIFICATE DO ATTENDEES RECEIVE ON COMPLETION OF THIS COURSE?

An OPITO accredited rigger initial training certification is awarded on successful completion of all theoretical and practical elements to demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the course content.

Learners then receive their logbook to carry out workplace experience under supervision. Once that is completed they can progress to the OPITO competence assessment.

The certification is valid for two years. If the workplace experience logbook and competence assessment are not successfully completed during this time the learner will need to undertake the three-day OPITO initial training again.
